### *Caring for Your Family Member*



#### Kittens 6 – 8 Weeks of Age

- **Wellness Examination**
- Evaluate: Weight, Body Score, Baby Teeth
- Vaccinations: Fvrcp, FeLV
- Testing: Fecal Parasite, FeLV FIV
- Information Regarding: Diet, Dental Care

#### Kittens 9 – 11 Weeks of Age

- **Wellness Examination**
- Evaluate: Weight, Body Score, Baby Teeth
- Vaccinations: Fvrcp, FeLV
- Other Preventives: Heartworm, Parasite
- Information Regarding: Ear Cleaning

#### Kitten 12 – 14 Weeks of Age

- **Wellness Examination**
- Evaluate: Weight, Body Score, Baby Teeth
- Vaccinations: Fvrcp, FeLV
- Other Preventives: Flea and Tick
- Information Regarding: Exercise, Behavior, Spay/Neuter, MicroChip

#### Kittens 15 – 17 Weeks of Age

- **Wellness Examination**
- Evaluate: Weight, Body Score, Baby Teeth
- Vaccinations: Fvrcp, FeLV, Juvenile Rabies
- Testing: PreOperative Blood Test
- Schedule Appointment for Spay/Neuter

#### Kittens 4 – 6 Months of Age

- **PreSurgical Examination**
- Procedure: Spay/Neuter, MicroChip Implant

#### Cats 16 Months to 8 Years of Age

- **Wellness Examination (1 to 2 times Annually)**
- Evaluate: Weight, Body Score, Dental Grade
- Blood Testing: Junior Early Detection Test
- Dental Prophylaxis (cleaning)
- Other Preventives: Heartworm, Flea & Tick
- Vaccinations\*: Fvrcp, FeLV, Rabies

#### Cats 9 to 20 Years of Age

- **Senior Wellness Examination (2 times Annually)**
- Evaluate: Weight, Body Score, Dental Grade
- Blood Testing: Senior Early Detection Test
- Arrhythmia, Blood & Eye Pressure Evaluations
- Dental Prophylaxis (cleaning)
- Abdominal / Thoracic Radiographs
- Vaccinations\*: Fvrcpp, FeLV, Rabies

#### Why does my cat need Blood Testing?

Both Early Detection Panels provide an overall health picture of your pet. They are simple tests that provide extensive results regarding specific internal organ function, and overall health.

The test results help your Veterinarian address any special medical concerns your cat may have .
